“God’s Love in Action”

2017 Lenten Sermon Series - "The Elementary Teachings of Christ"

Foundations are so important for the Christian life. They are the keys to spiritual growth and maturity. For that reason, I am choosing to do a Lenten series dedicated to that very end. Foundational doctrines (teachings) of the faith must be kept in harmony and balance if we are to stay on track with God's plan to grow us up as followers of Jesus Christ. The weaknesses we see in the body of Christ in our modern era can be traced to a fundamental weakness in its foundation of hearing and living out the basic truths of the Christian faith in daily life. Hebrews 6:1-2 lays out the basic elementary teachings concerning Jesus Christ as follows:

"Therefore let us leave the elementary doctrine of Christ and go on to maturity, not laying again a foundation of repentance from dead works and of faith toward God, and of instruction about washings, the laying on of hands, the resurrection of the dead, and eternal judgment" (English Standard Version, ESV).

The basic teachings are: (1) repentance from dead works, (2) faith towards God, (3) instruction about washings (sanctification), (4) laying on of hands (spiritual authority), (5) the resurrection of the dead and (6) eternal judgment.

As great as these foundational teachings are, an over-emphasis on any one of them to the exclusion of others can create an imbalance in our daily Christian life. Hebrews 6:1 begins by encouraging us to "leave the elementary doctrine of Christ and go on to maturity." This is not an encouragement to abandon any teachings about Jesus Christ but to move past (grow beyond) them and on to spiritual maturity. As followers of Jesus, our calling is to go on into the deeper teachings about our privileges in Jesus Christ.

Worship during Lent will be 4:30 PM and 6:15 PM with the following sermon titles:

March 1 (Ash Wednesday & Communion) - "Repentance from Dead Works"

March 8 - "Faith Toward God"

March 15 - "Instruction about Washings" (sanctification)

March 22 - "Laying on of Hands" (spiritual authority)

March 29 - "Resurrection of the Dead"

April 5 - "Eternal Judgment"

As the book of Hebrews teaches, these truths are the basic foundation of spiritual growth and maturity. Understanding and walking in them opens the door to the deeper things of God and our experience of knowing Jesus Christ and his ways and purposes for us.

Spiritual maturity is described in Ephesians 4:14-15:

"So that we may no longer be children, tossed to and fro by the waves and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by human cunning, by craftiness in deceitful schemes. Rather, speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ."

I have always believed that basic Christian truths bear repeating often as the level of spiritual growth and maturity in a church is always changing over time for many different reasons. Even the Apostle John hinted at this when he wrote:

"Beloved, I am writing you no new commandment, but an old commandment that you had from the beginning. The old commandment is the word that you have heard. At the same time, it is a new commandment that I am writing to you, which is true in him and in you" (1 John 2:7-8).

John realized in his day that timeless truths bear repeating, even when it has been heard, preached, or taught before. Repeating the 'old' (previously taught or heard) can become 'new' (heard again differently) and fresh by the Holy Spirit for our benefit. Along with this sermon series, our music director Melanie is planning on integrating aspects of the Holden Music Series into worship during Lent.

We hope your Lenten season will be fruitful, meaningful, and reflective!

We iron, cut, sew and tie material into 60" x 80" large quilts and small crib size quilts. Our quilts are assembled with a back, batting and pieced tops.

Some history on what the quilters have done:

2016: 22 large quilts to Prairie Ridge Healthcare, Mason City, Iowa; 22 small quilts to the Women's Homeless Shelter, Mason City, Iowa; 1 large quilt to the St. John Fall Festival silent auction

2015: 54 lap quilts to local nursing home; 27 large quilts & 30 Bandana dresses to Haiti

2014: 100 large quilts to Lutheran World Relief

2013: 75 large quilts to Lutheran World Relief; 10 large quilts to Haiti

2012: 6 sewing kits to Lutheran World Relief; 24 quilts to Lutheran World Relief

We rely on monetary donations and donated cotton material for this ministry. At this time, the quilters need bright colors, floral, prints and other suitable cotton material for quilt tops.

The AM session for that class meets from 8:30-11:30 a.m. Families who have a child who will be at least 4 on or before September 15 can register for one of our afternoon classes. The 3-day session meets Monday-Wednesday-Friday from 12:30-3:30 p.m. and the 5-day session meets EVERY day from 12:30-3:30 p.m. A non-refundable registration fee is due at the time of registration.
