## It's Wear Your Name Tag Month!



With the support that you have given, the church has been able to make some much needed improvements to the parsonage. More specifically we have fixed and replaced some appliances put in new carpet and are continuing to work on a few others. This summer we also made some necessary major repairs to the bus. The bus is a great way for the church to continue to provide opportunities for special mission trips, and transportation of youth for after school programs. The need for the bus continues to grow for helping our congregation and others in our community.

As part of our Ministry Support Plan we give 10% of all money given according to the following guidelines:

This year we have given 8% of the thank offering, loose offering and holiday offering to help EPIC scholarship funds, Food for the Poor, Crisis Intervention, North Lights Homeless Shelter, and Compassion. We believe these funds help those in need locally and globally. Thank you for sharing your blessings!

One of the challenges we face is managing the Ministry Support Plan when the income (offering) varies quite a bit from week to week and month to month. Please consider making your giving regular using Simply Giving. There is a form included and you can set up your giving to be every week, twice a month or monthly.




