**“God’s Love in Action”**

As the Halloween decorations, costumes, and candy begin to come out in the stores and our October days are punctuated with visions of little ghosts, I remember an adventure my wife and I had going to visit Glensheen Mansion in Duluth, MN.

We were hosting family and one of our family members has a background in decorative arts. Because of that, we suspected that a tour of Glensheen might be a very interesting way to spend a Sunday afternoon. Boy, were we right! "Decorative" doesn't even begin to describe Glensheen! It's decorations on steroids! And for those of us who didn't care much about the decorations, it was also fun to walk around one of the "Top 5 Most Haunted Places in Duluth" looking for ghosts in back stairways!

The mansion was very appealing in its turn-of-the-century grandeur. But, what really stuck with me from that tour, was the light fixtures. You see, the house was constructed in 1905 just as electric lights were beginning to replace gas lamps. So, as we walked from room to room, I kept looking at the lights trying to figure out if they had been gas or electric. Each fixture was a cluster of three lamps - two had light bulbs in them, one did not. I thought maybe it was an effort to reduce their light bill by one-third ... or maybe they were all originally gas lamps and when electricity came in they only switched two-thirds of them to bulbs because bulbs are brighter. While others were taking in the decorations, I was obsessing about the lights. I had to know!

"Why are there only two bulbs in the light fixtures?" I asked. "That's a very good question!" the tour guide responded enthusiastically. I liked him a lot.

He went on to explain that the house was built at a time when electricity was becoming very popular. So, wanting the latest and greatest technology in his mansion, the owner had electricity put in. But, he was also worried that maybe this electricity thing was just a fad ... maybe it would run its course and soon gas lamps would be the order of the day again. So, he had both installed. All of his light fixtures had three lamps - two electric and one gas... just in case. He wanted electricity, but it was scary to let go of the comfort and familiarity of gas.

Like it or not, change happens. That change often brings exciting, new, and helpful things into our lives. And it also brings fear, loss, and anxiety. To think that we can have change without both is unrealistic. Even now as you read this, I'm guessing that something is changing in your life. May God give you strength and peace in that change. And even now as you read this, changes are happening in the world and in society that will require the church to change, too. May God give us strength and peace as we go through those changes together.

As we go on adventures now in our new home here in Iowa and give thanks to God for bringing us to the treasures of St. John and Charles City, I'm reminded that, as scary as it is, change can be a really good thing!

### **Ascension Window Renovation Fund Raiser, *the story***

We discovered the Ascension Window in the storage room over the Narthex while sifting through years of documents and historical items earlier this year. John Swiggum found it and brought it to my attention. After seeing it, it was obvious that such a wonderful original window from 1922 should be preserved, as well as the remnants of glass that were also stored along with it. With the 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of our congregation coming up in 2022, I took it to Council who agreed with the idea that the window should be preserved and that if there was a way to turn the remnants into useable items in conjunction with the anniversary (to help pay for it), we should investigate it. There was also no budget for this project.

Long story short, I found a stained-glass artist, Eddie Hesalroad, that could restore the panel and that it was rare glass and irreplaceable because of the way it had been hand painted and fired nearly 100 years ago. Because of its rarity, he will clean it, replace missing leading and put an alloy framework around it to make it stand up to another 100 years. There will still be some small cracks, but they will be firmed up by the framing. We also gave him some other panels that were broken, but part of the areas around the main panel that had beautiful colors and leaves and were basically stunning in their own right. Since we had no budget, he agreed to start the project with a \$500 commission fee (donated by Women's Ministry) **and redo the smaller panels, to be part of a silent auction fund raiser in October.**

Some of us learned to do stained glass from watching YouTube and spending a few sessions with Lori Janssen, who does this every winter when she goes south. I found a couple of other people with knowledge and equipment, like Linda Johnson, who lent us a lot of equipment needed to do this art. We have met most Mondays in the last few months to make jewelry and sun-catchers to sell to the congregation and some of us worked at home in between.

The result is about 150 pieces of stained-glass jewelry and sun-catchers made by members of this congregation that will be on sale this October as part of the fund-raiser. The volunteers making these pieces are so happy to be able to share some of this historic stained glass with members of the congregation. Our hard work to make this project happen was a testament to our love for St. John, a feeling we hope you share.

**We will be selling these items and having the silent auction for the panels on the first three Sundays in October, the 7<sup>th</sup>, 14<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup>.**

**The auction will stop when the second service starts on the 21<sup>st</sup>.** At this point we will determine the winners of the panels, which will be posted. They can be paid for and picked up after the second service, or I will call the winners, not present, to let them know that they can be picked up during the week at the church.

After we pay Mr. Hesalroad, we will bring the Ascension window to the church and phase 2 will begin, which is framing, back-lighting and maybe an outlet. This will be displayed inside the entryway to the church as a lasting reminder of 150 proud years of this congregation.

If anyone can help with set up, sales or break down on any of these days, I would appreciate it, because it is a lot of work. Thank you in advance for your generosity as we begin this final stage of the fund-raiser.
