

**“God’s Love in Action”**



This is the weirdest spring ever. As temperatures increase and volunteers from last year's garden begin to peek through the soil and a greenish hue slowly begins to creep back over the Iowa countryside, I know I should feel joyful, but it's hard this year. The coronavirus pandemic and the economic challenges that have come with it have turned our lives upside down. At a time when we usually all breathe a collective sigh of relief and optimistically look toward time spent outdoors, we find ourselves hunkered down inside filled with worries and fears.

We are butterflies reluctant to come out.

And so my thoughts turn to one of nature's more unusual creatures, the *mourning cloak butterfly*. Early naturalists gave it that name because they thought that its purple-black pattern with yellow trim looked a lot like a cloak that would be worn by someone who is in mourning. The mourning cloak butterfly is usually the first butterfly to emerge from winter sleep. It typically shows up in late March and early April.

It's unique among butterflies in that it's one of the few butterflies that hibernates as an adult. Most butterflies survive the winter as eggs, caterpillars, or chrysalises and in the spring they're transformed into something new. But the mourning cloak butterfly hangs out behind the bark of a tree or in a crack. Large segments of its body actually freeze solid in the winter. But when spring comes, the mourning cloak's wings work like little solar panels absorbing energy from the sun to reheat its frozen body. Then it flutters off to visit maple trees for a taste of spring sap ... still its same old self ... just happy to have survived the winter.

The mourning cloak reminds us that, in this life, we can't always change our situation and we can't always be transformed. Sometimes the best we can hope for is just to survive. So, as we go through this most unusual Easter season, I raise my glass to you ... the survivors! Here's to all of you who cannot change your situation, but still manage to wake up and greet the world with hopefulness. Here's to you who have faced the icy grip of death and returned to appreciate the sweetness of this life. Here's to you who have been frozen by financial downturn and yet spread your wings, confident that better, warmer days are coming. Here's to all of you who manage to soar, even in a mourning cloak. May you find strength in our risen Lord knowing that one day, no matter how impossible it seems, we will all be reborn ... all of us ... even you.

Spring greetings from your friends at St. John Christian Preschool! It is hard to imagine that we are getting close to the end of another great year at St. John Christian Preschool. The time has gone by so fast!

As everyone is aware, our preschool has been closed since March 6. March 9-13 we were on Spring Break, and then the Coronavirus pandemic forced all of the schools in the state to shut down until April 13. Online learning has become our new normal! We created a new weekly schedule with different daily themes: Make It Monday (crafts/projects), Story Time Tuesday (we read 3-4 stories associated with the theme of the week), Worship Wednesday (devotion/praise music), Thinking Thursday (learn something new/ STEM experiments), and Foodie Friday (kitchen creations)! All lessons are done LIVE daily on our Facebook page between 1-3pm! Join us!!

We also read the Bible story every day and post a daily devotional for all ages, using Sarah Young's, Jesus Calling series! Pastor Russ also joins us LIVE every Wednesday to read the Bible story to our young friends!! We are so glad to keep this tradition going!

We are so bummed that we won't be able to take our friends on a walk through the church the week before Easter and introduce the concept of Good Friday to them. We'll just have to make it a virtual tour!

We are currently running our All-School Fundraiser. We are selling Scratch Cupcakes! Mmmm! This fundraiser will run until Friday, April 3rd. As of now, delivery is still scheduled for Thursday, April 23rd from 3:30-5:00pm. You can pick up your order in the choir room. **This current fundraiser will directly benefit the school, as a whole, by allowing us to purchase many supplies and equipment for all the children to use.** We are hoping to purchase new large foam blocks, new baby dolls, and some new play mats.
