

A message from Greg Buenger, St. John Church Council President: In

response to the current COVID-19 situation, the St. John Lutheran Church Executive Committee and Church Council are recommending that the church remain closed until at least June 1, 2020. We feel this is an appropriate response to help minimize the spread of COVID-19 and protect the health and well-being of our congregation. Our bishop and other church leaders in Iowa are urging congregations to refrain from restarting in-person church gatherings too soon. We will continue to evaluate how things develop over the next four weeks and make further decisions about church activities in late May.

From Pastor Russ: We will continue our radio and online worship services until it's safe for us to worship in person again. Let's continue to hold each other in prayer and know that God is with us right where we are. *Peace be with you!*

It has been recommended by the Governor of Iowa that all those who can work from home SHOULD work from home. St. John has the technology that enables the staff to do so. - ➤ The Synod Assembly in June has been postponed. The 2020 Northeastern Iowa Synod Assembly will be held August 22 at Nazareth Lutheran Church in Cedar Falls, Iowa. Please note change of location. Due to the unknown duration of the COVID-19 pandemic, updated registration forms will be mailed to congregations on June 22. Registration forms will also be available on the synod website. The Synod Council and staff will continue to monitor restrictions on large gatherings. If we need to cancel/postpone August 22, a decision will be made by July 15. The alternate date of August 22nd has been selected for the main purpose of electing a new bishop.
- ➤ Music at St. John: due to the extension of the "Social Distancing" recommendation of April 30th by the federal government, all St. John choirs will not reconvene until the Fall season.
