Pastor's Note

It's official. This is going to be the strangest Christmas ever. Well, it's going to be the strangest one in my lifetime, anyway: no service at the church, no Christmas caroling, no family gatherings for us, and a hundred other little things that just won't be the same. As it turns out, it was a lot harder to find our way out of this pandemic than we thought it would be.

It reminds me of a trip I was part of several years ago to a corn maze. It was a lot of fun wandering through the stalks, looking for signs, and trying to find the way out. And, to make things a little more interesting, the operators of the maze also provided us with Bible questions to help us find our way. Whenever we came to a numbered sign, we had to answer a multiple-choice Bible question for that corresponding number. Depending on the answer we chose, we were directed to go either to the left or to the right. Some of the questions were simple like: "What were the names of the man and woman that God created first?" and "The Israelites created a golden statue in the shape of which animal?" But some of the questions were harder like: "The word "corn" appears in the Bible how many times? a) 94 b) 198 c) 47 " Do you have any idea? Yeah, neither did we. We were very thankful for our cell phones and their data plans! (The answer is "a", by the way.)

Yet, even though we had all of those signs and clues to guide us, finding our way out of the maze was a lot more challenging than we expected. The people of Israel had the same problem. God had promised to send a messiah to rescue them and to show them the way out of their suffering. They had clues from the ancient scriptures to help them and they were continually on the lookout for signs. Yet, it was still challenging and took much longer than they expected - hundreds of years longer. But, finally, they saw the sign ... a bright star in the East. Yet even with the star, it took the Wise Men two years to find the baby Jesus AND they had to stop in Jerusalem to get directions!

Life is often more complicated than we expected or wanted it to be. That's especially true this year. Even with the Bible to guide us, we can find it difficult to navigate the maze of decisions and situations we're facing on a daily basis. But the good news is that, despite our confusion and limited understanding, the messiah did come. And he didn't come just for Israel ... he came for all of us ... even those of us who are now living through a pandemic.

It's going to be a strange Christmas, but maybe we can use this special year to cut away some of the clutter of the season and focus a little more clearly on what Christmas is really about. As you celebrate the birth of Christ this month in whatever complicated and confusing situation you find yourself this Christmas, remember that Jesus has come to show us the way out ... the way out of sin and selfishness ... the way out of death ... the way out of fear and despair. But we have to follow him, even when things are strange. The way isn't always easy, but it's worth the trip. Merry Christmas!

Nuetzman served as the pastor of both Calmar and Springfield Lutheran Churches. She now lives in Mason City with her husband, Dennis. Let's hold Pastor Anita and Dennis in our prayers!

Our Generosity in October

Your offerings to St. John were shared beyond our walls in July in the Following ways:


8% of our regular October offering (\$1663.38) went to support the mission of the larger church.

2% of our total offering goes to support our community needs. In September (\$624.01) was given to Messiah's Food Pantry.

The Finance Board voted to give (\$400.00) to the Floyd County Salvation Army Fund, (\$300.00) to the YMCA, and (\$288.29) to "Toys for Tots" out of the 8% Quarterly Thank Offering Benevolence fund.

"Drive Through Communion"

On December 6th between 10:00 a.m. & 11:30 a.m. we will have "Drive Through Communion. We also plan to offer this communion on the 1st Sunday of each month. We will ask that you enter the parking lot at the top. You will proceed down to the canopy where you will be handed a disposable communion cup with wafer. Next you will proceed to the pastor to partake of communion. Gluten free cups will be available.



Advent begins November 29th! Advent is a call to followers of Christ to remember the birth of the Savior. The word *advent* stems from a Latin word that means “coming” or “arrival.” The season begins on the fourth Sunday before Christmas and, depending on the year, can range from 22 to 28 days. Its purpose is to help believers remain focused on the birth of Christ and Jesus’ glorious return.

Family Advent Wreath Craft

Time needed: 30-45 minutes (1-2 adults with toddler/preschooler/kid assistance)

Materials needed:

Green tissue paper (2 sheets) - they do not have to be the same shade of green!

Green construction paper (1 sheet)

Purple construction paper (2 sheets)

Pink construction paper (1 sheet)

4 long yellow pipe cleaners (12 inches long)

4 empty cardboard toilet paper rolls (or 2 empty cardboard paper towel rolls cut in half)

Masking tape, Scissors, Glue, Stapler (optional)

Wreath Directions:

1. Fold the green construction paper in half lengthwise. Cut in a straight line along the fold. You will only need 1 of these pieces.
2. Take that piece of green construction paper and fold in half lengthwise again. Cut in a straight line along the fold. You should now have two long, thin pieces of green construction paper.
3. Take both pieces of paper and glue or staple the ends together so you have one very long, skinny piece of green construction paper. This is the base of the wreath. Set aside to dry.
4. Take the green tissue paper, and fold in half twice so it is close to the shape of a square. Cut along all of the folds. You should have 4 squares. Cut each square into thirds. Then, cut each third into thirds. (I placed each of the 4 large squares on top of each other and then cut them all at together - this saves a lot of time!) Repeat for the second piece of tissue paper. You should yield 36 squares per sheet of tissue paper so 72 squares total. (Don't worry about the cuts being even or straight - it does not need to be perfect!)
