## <u>Pastor's</u> <u>Notes...</u>

If there's anything worth calling theology, it is listening to people's stories, listening to them and cherishing them.

— MARY PELLAUER

Dear Friends in Christ,

What I do as St. John's newest visitation pastor isn't anything fancy. Listening to people's stories seldom requires me to draw upon my (basic) command of Greek or quote Luther's Works. But it's important ministry, nonetheless. I know this is so because the risen Christ models this very thing when he appears to two travelers on the road between Jerusalem and Emmaus. (Luke 24:13-35) Notice that Jesus enters this relationship without words, simply walking along with the two while "they were talking to each other about all the things that had happened." What's more, the Greek words used suggest their conversation was an emotional one, which you'd expect after the trauma of Jesus' crucifixion.

Some of the roads we walk are like that, too, the kind marked, MINIMUM MAINTENANCE -TRAVEL AT YOUR OWN RISK. I've been on quite a few of those. You see, my path to becoming a pastor has been a long and winding one. So, chances are I've been on some of the same bumpy roads as you. And God uses those to guide me in my ministry. Theologian Paul Tillich wrote, "The first duty of love is to listen." It's also been said (I've forgotten by whom) that ninety percent of ministry is just showing up. So, I understand my number one job here at St. John is to show up, walk alongside you on whatever road you're on and hear what's going on in your life. In the midst of that journey, Christ will be

*there.* He doesn't wait until *after* we get to wherever we're going, when things get better, and the way becomes smooth, but goes right through the roughest, most dangerous, most painful parts *with* us.

So, even though the word "visitation" normally suggests seeing those who are sick, homebound or in long term care, it certainly doesn't preclude me from coming alongside other folks as well. In fact, since we're all part of the one Body of Christ, it makes good sense for us *all* to stay connected, to each other and to God. That's where I may be able to help, if not in-person just yet, then by phone, email, letter or social media (I regularly use Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, and Snapchat).



Now, it's going to take some time for me to recognize all of you, so when you see me, give a wave, ok? Your Companion in Christ,

#### From the St. John Lutheran Church Council:

Electronic Giving – this is an option that has been added to the St. John Evangelical Lutheran Church website in recent months. But it is also convenient if you want to use it for one-time transactions – to give to specific funds, events, or memorials for instance. You can give through your personal accounts or credit cards. Just remember that if you use your credit card, unless you specifically indicate the service charge be taken from your account, St. John will be assessed that charge. ### Our Generosity in November

2% of our total offering goes to support our community needs. In November (\$768.20) was given to the Floyd County Salvation Army Red Kettle Fund.

### "Drive Through Communion"

On January 3<sup>rd</sup> between 10:00 a.m. & 12:00 p.m. we will have "Drive Through Communion. We also plan to offer this communion on the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of each month. We will ask that you enter the parking lot at the top. You will proceed down to the canopy where you will be handed a disposable communion cup with wafer. Next you will proceed to the pastor to partake of communion. Gluten free cups will be available.

### Sound and Video Capital Campaign

It is hard to believe that it has been two years since we dreamed, planned, and installed our new sound and video system in the sanctuary. The congregation pledged and donated a total of \$135,968.49. Of this amount \$68,691.44 was given outright with \$67,295 pledged. To date there is over \$18,000 in outstanding pledges. Please consider fulfilling your pledge to bring this project to a close. Thank you for all your generous support over this two-year period.


