DEVOTIONS



Read: Revelation 21:1-6a.

In Revelation 21 God's victory is seen as a new beginning. The victory is not the popularized "rapture" of departing from God's creation, but affirming God's ongoing work of creating a new heaven and earth, right here for us to enjoy. In the meantime, we trust in God's good work to happen in our lives and for all of creation. A new year is a good time to recall what we value and hope for: God's creative and gracious power that will make all things new and, in the process, one day wipe away every tear, and put an end to death itself. In 2022, let that message bring comfort and strength for the message of Revelation is "trustworthy and true." It is the message of the all-powerful One, "the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end." Discuss: What do you hope for based on God's promised vision for you and all creation? Pray: God of heaven and earth, give us faith to trust in your promises, to take away our sadness and make all things new through Christ Jesus, the Lamb who was slain and begins his reign. Amen.

SERVICE

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS



The eighth day after Jesus' birth, Mary and Joseph, according to Jewish tradition, presented him at the temple. It was on this day that Jesus was given his name (Luke 2:21). This name was told to Mary by an angel before he was conceived (Luke 1:31). The Festival of the Holy Name of Jesus is celebrated on January 1. At the beginning of each new year, people want to make resolutions that change the way they live. For Christians, the daily experience of repentance and giving thanks through prayer for God's love through Jesus Christ can be life-changing. Think or talk about ways you can commit to daily prayer in the new year. Then say this blessing: In the name of Jesus, the Alpha and the Omega, may God bless you.
