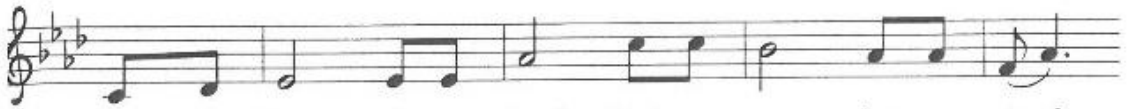

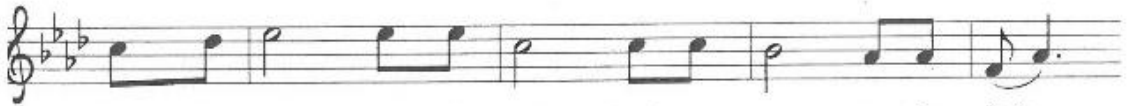

Update on the Bell

Roger Michael says he was told it was from the previous church. It would be nice if we got information or confirmation from anyone else in the know, but Roger is a good source.

We discovered that the old bell does have a clapper inside and it has 1892 stamped into its metal stand. A church history book references that there was a rebuilding and enlargement of the old church that was completed in 1893, more evidence that it is probably from the old church.

Our interest in this is historical and related to the upcoming 100th anniversary of our current church. It has been suggested to have it cleaned and fixed up a bit to put on display outside our church in honor of that anniversary since it would have been rung for the last time 100 years ago.
