Affirmation of Baptism (Rite of Confirmation)

Presentation of the Affirmation of Baptism Class of 2022

At the conclusion of the hymn of the day, the Confirmation class will stand.

A representative of the congregation will present those making affirmation.

I present these Confirmands who desire to make public affirmation of their baptism.

Affirmation of Baptism (Rite of Confirmation)

Pastor: Let us pray. Merciful God, we thank you for these sisters & brothers, whom you have made your own by water and the Word in baptism. You have called them to yourself, enlightened them with the gifts of your Spirit, and nourished them in the community of faith. Uphold your servants in the gifts and promises of baptism and unite the hearts of all whom you have brought to new birth. We ask this in the name of Christ. **Amen**

Profession of Faith:

I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church.

Do you reject the devil and all the forces that defy God?

Confirmands: I reject them.

Do you reject the powers of this world that rebel against God?

Confirmands: I reject them.

Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God?

Confirmands: I reject them.

Do you believe in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; He ascended into heaven, He is seated at the right hand of the Father, And He will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Affirmation in the presence of the Assembly

Confirmands be seated. Come forward with your family & sponsors as your name is called.

The pastor, family & sponsors lay hands on the head of the person

Pastor: Stir up in *Confirmand* the gift of your Holy Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence, both now and forever. **Amen**

After each Confirmand has affirmed their baptism and returned to the pew, you will stand and face the congregation and ...

P: Let us rejoice with these sisters and brothers in Christ.

Congregation: We rejoice with you in the life of baptism. Together we will give thanks and praise to God and proclaim the good news to all the world.
