Pastor Anita Nuetzman:

Dear People of God at St. John,

Did I tell you yet that I'm a grandmother?! I hope you'll forgive me if I've already mentioned it. I guess I am kind of excited.



You see, my husband and I have been "empty-nesters" now for 7 years. That's a long time with no kids in the house for a former stay-at-home mom like me, whose life pretty much revolved around taking care of them and attending all their activities.

As chaotic as they were sometimes, I sure do miss those days. In fact, I was feeling so sad one day that I decided to make something for supper that we hadn't eaten since the kids were home: hot dogs wrapped in crescent roll dough, sometimes called pigs-in-a-blanket.

Off to the store I went to get the kid-approved brand of wieners and refrigerated rolls. Back at home, I opened the tube with a loud POP... but there were no happy shrieks of surprise. It was quiet.

So, I set about wrapping each of the wieners in a triangle of dough, by myself, starting at the wide end, just like I had showed the kids. But no one was there to help me. When the crusts were golden (*but not burned!*), I served them up for my husband and me, along with some macaroni and cheese (*from the box*). But as we sat there, I realized something still wasn't right. Tears welled up in my eyes because what I'd known all along became obvious: *it wasn't really about the food*.





You may have noticed this summer that in John's gospel, Jesus talks (*a lot*) about bread. I counted at *least* 20 times that it's mentioned in chapter 6 *alone*. And nobody who was listening seemed to understand what he was trying to say. (Heck, *I'm* still struggling!) But I think it's safe to say that it *wasn't really about the food*.

As we are emerging now from some of the restrictions that the pandemic placed on our everyday lives, (unless the delta variant throws a wrench into our plans) many of us who longed for a sense of normalcy are eager now to return to all the things we did before, to bring back all those good feelings we've been missing. But friends, *it isn't really about the things*.

Recall our communion liturgy, if you will, where you always hear Pastor Russ and I say, "... do this for the remembrance of me." As Lutherans, we believe Jesus Christ is *really and truly present* in, with, and under the bread and wine (you may have improvised with what you had on hand) when we receive the sacrament of Holy Communion. But *it wasn't really about the things*, was it?

In each of these cases, what we crave in our hearts isn't some<u>thing</u>, but some<u>one</u>. At least I think that's what St. Augustine was talking about when he wrote, "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our heart is restless until it rests in you."

My prayer is that, in the midst of our restlessness, our anxiousness, to return to life-as-usual, we discover the peace and joy that we're all longing for doesn't really come from the *things* we might think it does. Rather, it's found in a *person* --- Christ himself, who through his life, death and Resurrection, is ready and available, anytime or anywhere, *for us*.

That's a promise we can depend on, no matter how unfamiliar or uncertain the coming days or weeks or months might be.

"The Iowa Café"

The Department of Aging in partnership with Elderbridge Area Agency on Aging has a new program called **Iowa Café**. This project will transform traditional congregate meal sites to attractive restaurant partnership sites for older adults (60+ and spouse) to gather and enjoy nutritious meals. Meals will be free (individuals will be given the opportunity to contribute to the cost of the meal, however). Local restaurants participating in the program are The Blue Heron Bar & Grill in Mason City, IA and the 10th Hole in Riceville, Iowa.

FYI on the 150th Anniversary of St. John Lutheran Church

As many of you know, next year is the 150th Anniversary of St. John. This is not the anniversary of the church building; it is the anniversary of the congregation. The current church building will be 98 years old next year, it was dedicated in 1924.



The anniversary we are celebrating is based on a group of people of German origin that settled in the area. They began meeting in 1871 with a Rev. Adeeser of the Swedish Reformed Church, based in Plainfield. They had no actual church, but met in schools, store fronts and people's homes. In February of 1872, they extended a call to a Lutheran pastor, Rev. Wilke. In June of that year a resolution was passed to build a church and on September 1, 1872, they laid the cornerstone of what would be the first of the eventual three churches that have stood on the corner that St. John now

occupies. The church had its first services in the spring of 1873.

We have plans to observe our 150th Anniversary as a celebration throughout 2022. There is a committee currently planning some events, displays of history and probably some singing groups and a dinner (with German emphasis) that will happen on various Sundays.
