## Pastor Russ Leeper :

Recently, I was thinking about the church where I was baptized, Trinity Lutheran Church in Waterloo. And I realized that the last time I was there was at my grandmother's funeral in 2010.

It was a sad occasion, but it was also good to get together with a side of the family that rarely gathers. Many cousins were there that I hadn't seen for a long time and it brought back memories of the old days ... especially Christmas! It was so much fun when we all got together at Grandpa and Grandma's house on Christmas Eve. The adults sat upstairs playing cards while we kids took over the basement playing our own games and snooping through Grandma's piles of "old stuff" (something that I can reveal now only because Grandma has gone to be with Jesus). Then, after dinner and presents, we'd bundle up and head off to midnight service at Grandpa and Grandma's church. I loved that church! It was the place where I was baptized, the place where I first attended Sunday School, and the place where I first heard about Jesus. I remember sitting on the hard, wooden pews there during worship and hearing the pastor say, "Christ died for us," but through my young ears I was certain that he was saying, "Christ died for Russ." I thought that was cool.

But at Grandma's funeral in 2010, as I walked around that church, I was completely lost. Some parts of the building had been changed and other parts just didn't look familiar anymore. I wandered around trying to find my old Sunday School classroom, but I couldn't locate it. It made me sad to realize that these very important moments and places of my faith existed in memory only now. I couldn't go back to them. They were gone. In the 5 years I've been at St. John, I've given many tours of our building to people who grew up at St. John but hadn't been back in a long time. I've seen the same look of nostalgia mixed with loss on their faces, too. It's real.

As I talked with cousins at Grandma's funeral, I realized how much they, too, had changed since we were kids. We're related to each other, but we don't really know each other anymore. They all had kids that were older than we were when we played together in Grandma's basement. Grandma's gone, too, and eventually that house was sold. It's hard to let go of the things we love, hard to give up the past, hard to say good-bye to the people and situations that have been very important to us.

The Christmas season can be a time of mixed feelings. We joyfully cherish our memories of Christmases past while at the same time feeling grief over what and who we've lost. December can be a rough month for some.

But Advent and Christmas are ultimately about reminding us that our hope and joy comes not from where we've been, but where God is leading us: Mary saying "yes" to God's calling, Joseph obeying a dream to trust God, shepherds going where God's angels sent them, magi watching for God's sign and following when they saw it, and a centuries-old promise being fulfilled ... a child who would save his people ... not in the past, but in the future.

Loss is always difficult. But as we face this month, we remember that through it all, our true hope and true joy is not in the past. It comes from trusting our God who leads us into the future. And because of the Christ Child, that future is a bright eternity with all the people we've lost. May you have comfort and joy to you this Advent and Christmas season.

## **Special Congregational Meeting**

Sunday, December 4, 2022, we'll have a shortened communion service at 9 AM, followed by a special congregational meeting at 9:30 AM to vote on a proposed Lift Project (more details are coming). Because the final Christmas Program rehearsal and the Children's 25¢ Store are both happening that morning, we will need to be done by 10 AM.

At the January 2022 Annual meeting council was asked by the congregation to look into possible costs of an elevator or lift system. Council began conversation on several locations and options were explored along with costs. The best option that physically worked with our building and made sense for accessibility to offices, parish hall, basement and parking lot was to put a lift or elevator where the current church office is now and to shift the church office to where the current work room is. Due to estimates for an elevator unit spanning the basement to the top floor and needed construction costs to complete that project coming in at an excess of \$400,000, the council shifted our focus to a platform lift system option. A platform lift system and construction that goes from the parking lot to the main floor and the basement would cost approximately \$150,000. To go up to the third floor, a second lift would be required in the future, so construction on this project will allow room for a second lift to be added if that is an option the

congregation wants to consider in the future. After responding to the original request at the January 2022 Annual meeting, the council is bringing the platform lift project to the congregation for a vote on Dec. 4. If the congregation votes to move forward with the lift project, the church council recommends that in order to get to the \$150,000 needed for the project we pay for it as follows:

- \$80,000 from Memorial Fund which currently sits at \$160,454
- \$45,000 from Kroneman Capital Improvement Fund which currently sits at \$218,057
- \$20,000 from Sylvester Fund which are previously dedicated funds for this project
- \$1,188 from the Lift Fund
- \$4,000 raised from the 150th Anniversary Celebration

Cost estimates/quotes for the project include:

- Vertical Platform Lift: \$43,940
- Wedeking Electric Bid: \$9,622
- Randall Construction: \$67,625
- Artura Architecture: \$4,000
- Recommended contingency funds (19%): \$23,785.53
- TOTAL: \$148,972

We have applied for some grants that could bring in over \$10,000 and any additional donations we receive for the lift project would decrease the amount of money taken out of current funds. Please join with fellow St. John members on Dec. 4 at 9 AM for worship followed by a special congregational meeting to make this decision.

### **November Council Highlights:**

- Continuing to gather ideas of how our Council can continue to build our vision for God's Love in Action, we look forward to building off of the ideas presented at further council meetings.
- Council has been working with the Synod office to put a plan in place after approving moving forward with a call for a 1/2 Time Pastor. Based on the information collected and feedback from the NE Iowa Synod office, Pastor Steve Brackett, presented us with the option to join a Collaborative Learning program where we contract with students in training to fulfill our pastoral needs as they work through their education. We will be hosting a candidate on Nov. 20th and the council will meet in December to determine next steps.
- At the request of the congregation at the January 2022 Annual Meeting we wrapped up discussion on installing some type of lift system. Council is bringing the proposal to install a platform lift system to a congregational vote on Dec. 4th. More details can be found throughout our church communications.
- We have officially hired Rhonda Schmidtke for the Business Manager opening! We appreciate Karol Carpenter's work as Interim Business Manager these past several weeks, which has helped us prepare for the new hire!
- Continued forming a Nominating Committee as we look to replace council and board members who are stepping off our boards after various years of service.
