Out for Blood...

This month many of our fifth graders will celebrate their First Communion. But this will NOT be their first time to come to communion. For years, they've come forward for a blessing, watching and waiting for the day when it will be their turn to start receiving communion.

It was in that sacred moment ... that holy time when the bread and wine and grape juice were being distributed and all gathered in line waited with expectation to receive the body and blood of their savior. As was our procedure at that church, I was serving the wine and juice and blessing the people who weren't communing.

"This is the blood of Christ shed for you." I repeated the words again and again as, one after the other, I offered to each the cup of forgiveness.

Suddenly, my rhythm was broken by the presence of a child. He was a child I knew well, one of the congregation's preschoolers ... someone I had seen at communion many times before, but because of his age, he was not yet communing. As usual, I pulled back the tray of cups and bent over to place my hand on his head for a blessing.

"Child of God," I said, "the Lord Jesus Christ loves you forever."

As I pulled my hand away, his head sprang back, his eyes glared up at me, and in a tone of voice that we seldom hear at communion, he yelled at the top of his lungs: "I want the BLOOD!!!"

I laughed and thought, "my sentiments exactly." A snicker went through the congregation. His mother quickly put her arm around him and gave him that gentle, yet firm, squeeze that says, "Shhh!", and he turned his head to think about other things.

Dear child, as we begin this season of remembering the one who shed his blood, thank you for reminding us all how desperately we need that blood and how urgently we need the cup of forgiveness. I carry your cry with me and hold it in my heart, that I may never take the blood of Christ for granted. To you, dear child, and all the others just like you who, even at such a young age, come to the communion table with yearning, may God strengthen you and give you peace until the day comes when you, too, will hear those precious words: "This is the blood of Christ shed for you!"

GriefShare Begins at St. John

GriefShare provides help and encouragement after the death of a spouse, child, family member, or friend. Sessions will be led by St. John members in a warm, caring environment. A GriefShare orientation will be held Tuesday, February 21 at 6:30 PM in the chapel at St. John. The program itself will begin February 28 at 6:30 PM and run every Tuesday for 13 weeks. There is no cost to attend.

Weekly topics include: Is This Normal?, Challenges of Grief, The Journey of Grief – Part 1, The Journey of Grief – Part 2, Grief and Your Relationships, Why?, Guilt and Anger, Complicating Factors, Stuck, Lessons of Grief – Part 1, Lessons of Grief – Part 2, Heaven, and What Do I Live for Now? There are three key parts to the weekly GriefShare experience: video seminar, group discussion, and personal study exercises in a workbook.

You are welcome to begin attending our GriefShare group at any point. Each session is self-contained, so you don't have to attend in sequence. You will be able to pick up any sessions you missed in our next 13-week cycle. You can learn more about GriefShare at **www.griefshare.org.**

Dec./Jan. Council Highlights:

- We continue to average over 125 views per service on our virtual platform, with well over 300 viewing the Christmas Eve service!!
- Continuing to gather ideas of how our Council can continue to build our vision for God's Love in Action, we look forward to building off of the ideas presented at further council meetings.
- Based on the information collected and feedback from the NE Iowa Synod office, we approved an agreement with the NE Iowa Synod to join the Collaborative Learning Program. The two-year agreement centers around a student-intern working with our congregation and staff under Pastor Leeper's mentorship while she completes her programming to be ordained as a Deacon. The contract is for a 1/2 time basis and we look forward to welcoming the candidate in the near future as details are still being worked out on her start date.
- Excited to announce that the lift project is in motion. Based on feedback from the special meeting in November, Jaime, the Randall Construction team, our Buildings and Grounds board as well as others are looking at plans to adjust the project to a one-entry system to eliminate the need for a separate entrance for the lift. Thank you for the feedback at the meeting and we will keep you up with the details as they come in!
- Donated our Monthly Benevolence to jumpstart an exciting new opportunity. Pastor Russ and Susan brought a proposal to start a GriefShare program to the church. This program is specifically designed to help create support groups for those who have lost significant others. They have already secured some volunteers to get trained as facilitators, and these funds will help the program get started. Be on the lookout for more details to come!
- Big thanks to the efficient and effective work of the Nominating Committee, all board positions have been filled and we look forward to welcoming the new members during the February board meetings.
- For those of you who may not know, the Finance Board has a regular "Thanks" offering that is designated to help different people, programs, etc. We felt it was important to recognize this generosity as it is a testament to our mission of God's Love in Action. Most recently their donation put \$2,828 to pay off the Charles City schools lunch account deficit for families in need.
- Remind that the Annual Meeting is Sunday, Jan. 29th after service in the Parish Hall.
