## <u>Pastor Anita Nuetzman:</u>



Dear People of God at St. John,

On Wednesday, March 2, we begin our forty-day journey toward Easter.

As our foreheads are marked with ashes in the sign of the cross, we hear the words, "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return." It's one of the few times that many of us make a conscious effort to acknowledge that, sooner or later, we will die.

Some of us are confronted with death more often, either by virtue of the work that we do or family circumstances. If you're one of those people, then maybe you don't want or need any more reminders because it has been overwhelming enough already. I can sympathize with that.

But, for those of us who tend to avoid thinking about it, being reminded of our demise at least once a year is a good thing. The creators of one unusual app believe more often might be even better.

WeCroak is an app inspired by an old Bhutanese saying: "To be a happy person, one must contemplate death five times daily." The app sends alerts five times a day with an invitation to reflect on, meditate on, or simply be conscious of death. Reviews are mixed, but one user wrote, "When I first got the reminders from this app telling me, 'Don't forget, you're going to die,' it shocked me every time and gave me anxiety. Now that I've been seeing these reminders several times a day for over a month, I can feel that I'm relating to my inevitable death differently, with much more acceptance." This Lent, you may want to try the app and notice how regularly contemplating mortality changes

your perspective on life. If you do decide to give it a go, I'd like to hear about your experience. Lent might also be a good time to give some thought to funeral planning, either for yourself or a loved one. My experience working with grieving families over the past four and a half years has shown me just how unprepared most people are. Immediately after a death is a really difficult time to think about much more than anything beyond basic survival --- just remembering to eat and sleep are sometimes a chore.

And while faith in Christ may have been an important part of the life of the deceased person, it has increasingly become the case that family members don't share the same level of commitment to being part of a congregation. This makes planning a funeral service all the more difficult. Relevant scripture passages or meaningful hymns just don't come to mind as readily. Pastor Russ or I will gladly offer suggestions, but they may not be as personal.

Because, unfortunately, pastors don't always get the opportunity to meet people before they die. Of course, that isn't always possible, but why not give your pastor a chance to know you a little better before the funeral home calls?

Pastors have experience and resources for assisting people (and their families) who are facing all sorts of challenges, health-related and otherwise. And contrary to popular belief, we are neither too busy nor bothered by requests for our help.

In fact, we'd be more than happy to walk alongside you through whatever life brings. After all, it's what we are called to do!





Our registration began on Monday, February 14, for our families who are *currently* enrolled. Registration for *new* families began on Monday, February 21, and will continue until all of our classes are full. Families who have a child who will be at least 3 on or before September 15 can register for our morning class. That 3-day class meets Monday-Wednesday-Friday mornings from 8:30-11:30 a.m. Families who have a child who will be at least 4 on or before September 15 can register for one of our two afternoon classes. The 3-day session meets Monday-Wednesday-Friday from 12:30-3:30 p.m. and the 5-day session meets EVERY day from 12:30-3:30 p.m. A \$30 non-refundable registration fee is due at the time of registration.
