### Pastor Russ Leeper :

One day, years ago, I was driving down the highway on my way to a funeral. Suddenly the car, with no help from me, began blaring its horn in one long continuous blast. I beat on the horn button, but it didn't help. Other drivers were giving me strange looks and making hostile gestures, so I decided I'd better pull over and try to do something about it. I turned off the engine. The horn was still blaring. I started the engine again. No change. I beat on the horn button some more. Still nothing ... and to make it worse, I was already at the end of my list entitled: "Things I Know How to Do On a Car." There was only one thing left to try ... the thing that sends a shiver of fear down the spine of every mechanically incompetent person the world over - LOOK UNDER THE HOOD!

So, there I stood, along the side of the road in my suit and tie looking, with utter ignorance, under the hood of a smirking Honda Civic. Like Mr. Rogers trying to rob a bank or Arnold Schwarzenegger playing the role of the Little Mermaid, the job to be done and the person trying to do it had nothing in common.

The first impression I had after sticking my head under the hood was that it was noisy. I attributed this to the horn, but I wasn't certain. I wondered what a car horn might look like. In my mind I pictured the little plastic and rubber tooter that was attached to my bicycle handlebars when I was a kid. Nope, didn't see any of those. Somehow, I managed to stumble across a fuse box. I will forever owe a debt of gratitude to the Honda engineer who, one day at staff meeting, spoke up and said, "Why don't we put a diagram right on the lid of the fuse box showing what each of the fuses is for!" Because I looked down and there on the top of the fuse box, like manna from heaven, was a diagram. Written on that diagram, in big letters, were what at that moment seemed to be the two sweetest words in the English language: "STOP HORN." I found the correct fuse, pulled it out, and, oh, the silence was beautiful! And I prayed: "Oh Lord, for this fuse and the diagram that lead me to it, I give You thanks!"

The Apostle Paul wrote: "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

Paul reminds us to live life thankfully and to give thanks in all circumstances. Maybe things haven't been going so well with you lately. That means you're human. Life is life. Things happen - good things and bad things. But no matter what happens, good or bad, the love of God in Christ Jesus is with you, in you, and for you. We can rejoice and give thanks in all circumstances because, no matter what happens to us, we're God's beloved children, forgiven through Jesus Christ, and God will never, ever let us go ... not ever.

Every time we gather as a congregation at St. John, we gather around that promise. We come together with all our experiences, good and bad, and together we say "Thank you, Lord ... thank you for loving us and being our God." I hope you'll come and add your voice to the thanksgiving!

That old Honda Civic with the broken horn taught me a lesson: keep your eyes open because God's blessings can and do come in all situations. Eventually, we managed to sell that car ... and for that I am truly thankful!
