Our Generosity for 3rd Quarter 2023

Your offerings to St. John were shared beyond our walls in the 3rd Quarter in the Following ways:

8% of our regular offering \$5,759.99 went to support the mission of the larger church.

2% of our total offering goes to support our community needs. The July recipient was God's Work Our Hands in the amount of \$753.97, the August recipient was God's Work Our Hands-Youth Fellowship Outreach in the amount of \$589.71 and the September recipient was Grief Share in the amount of \$606.60. Those checks were dispersed to be used for this mission within our church community.

The 8% Thank Offering was shared with the Holiday Cheer program throughout the Community Revitalization Corporation. A check for \$2,041.22 will be sent to them for upcoming community needs at Christmas time.

On Sunday, November 12th, Angel Tree tags will be available in the Narthex before and after service. Angel Tree provides gifts for children of incarcerated parents, food and religious materials for their families, and Bibles for the prisoners. Please support the program again this year.


